



# **Endowment Fund Descriptions**

#### **Ambassador Fund**

This fund was established in December 2000 by the Wisconsin Agricultural and Life Sciences Alumni Association (WALSAA) to support the student ambassador program in the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences (CALS).

#### **Dean's Residence Fund**

This fund supports the renovation and remodeling of the building's first floor lobby. WALSAA's contribution to this project, specifically the formal naming of the lobby space, will be recognized and displayed on the donor wall within the finished building space.

#### **Outstanding Advisor Award Fund**

The WALSAA Outstanding Advisor Award Fund was established in October 1997 as part of the WALSAA 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gala to recognize a member of the CALS faculty for exceptional student advising service.

#### **Student Award Fund**

The Student Award Fund was established by WALSAA with a \$20,000 donation on March 1, 1991. The fund supports student travel awards, scholarships, intern experiences, and other student recognition and professional development opportunities.

#### **Outstanding Sophomore Award**

WALSAA also recognizes FISC students with Outstanding Leadership and Activity Awards and Academic Excellence Awards.

#### WALSAA Outstanding Advisor Award

WALSAA has been honoring advisors with the Outstanding Advisor Award since 1979. The 2017 recipient was Molly Reinhard, a CALS senior student services coordinator.

#### **WALSAA Student Impact Grants**

WALSAA supports CALS student organizations by providing excellent leadership and professional development opportunities through our Impact Grant program. Organizations apply for necessary dollars towards special projects, professional development activities, educational trips, etc.

Here are a few of the 2017 WALSAA Impact Grant recipients and what the funding was put towards:

- Association of Women in Agriculture Etiquette Dinner Funded a dinner where association members learn etiquette for professional events.
- **Badger Dairy Club Tour** Supported the travel of 22 students for a California Central Valley dairy and business tour
- Badger Meat Science Club Conference Supported travel and registration fees for four students to the Reciprocal Meats Conference at Texas A&M, where they competed in a processing contest, attended seminars, and networked with industry peers.
- Food Science Club Product Development Teams Supported seven product teams responsible for developing a new and innovative food product and carrying the concept through marketing and production.
- UW-Madison National Agri-Marketing Association Trip Supported the travel of 21 students to attend the National Agri-Marketing Association conference to compete in the student marketing competition.
- UW-Madison Quarter-Scale Tractor Team Competition Designed, built and tested a quarter-scale pulling tractor for the International Quarter-Scale Competition held by the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers each spring.
- Plant Sciences Graduate Student Council Plant Sciences Symposium -Focused on promoting knowledge and appreciation of plant sciences through presentations given by researchers from both the public and private sector.
- Village Health Project Profitable Pork Budget in Lweza, Uganda - This student organization encompasses the humanitarian principles propagated by the Wisconsin idea. Working closely with the Lweza community, this funding helped supply the addition of 10 pigs and four pig pens as a continuation of a current livestock project.
