Please read through Snapshot to learn how your support is helping our members stay connected, network and give back to CALS.



WALSAA is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization that supports the connection of students, faculty and alumni to the UW-Madison College of Agricultural & Life Sciences.



### **Endowment Fund Descriptions**

#### Ambassador Fund

This fund was established in December 2000 by the Wisconsin Agricultural and Life Sciences Alumni Association (WALSAA) to support the student ambassador program in the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences (CALS).

### Dean's Residence Fund

This fund supports the renovation and remodeling of the building's first floor lobby. WALSAA's contribution to this project, specifically the formal naming of the lobby space, will be recognized and displayed on the donor wall within the finished building space.

#### **Outstanding Advisor Award Fund**

The WALSAA Outstanding Advisor Award Fund was established in October 1997 as part of the WALSAA 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gala to recognize a member of the CALS faculty for exceptional student advising service.

### **Student Award Fund**

The Student Award Fund was established by WALSAA with a \$20,000 donation on March 1, 1991. The fund supports student travel awards, scholarships, intern experiences, and other student recognition and professional development opportunities.

### **WALSAA Fund**

This fund was established to support WALSAA activities, programs and publications. It is primarily used to support programming for members.

### **WALSAA Scholarship Fund**

This fund was established in December 2018 by WALSAA for gifts designated specifically for student scholarships.

### **Outstanding Sophomore Award**

WALSAA recognized 10 exemplary sophomore CALS students last year. Students go through an application process, screening and personal interviews to each receive the \$2,000 recognition.

### **Outstanding FISC Student Award**

WALSAA also recognizes FISC students with Outstanding Leadership and Activity Awards and Academic Excellence Awards.

### **WALSAA Outstanding Advisor Award**

WALSAA has been honoring advisors with the Outstanding Advisor Award since 1979. The 2018 recipient was Sarah Botham, a CALS faculty associate and advisor for the UW-Madison student chapter of the National Agri-Marketing Association (NAMA).

### **WALSAA Student Impact Grants**

WALSAA supports CALS student organizations by providing excellent leadership and professional development opportunities through our Impact Grant program. Organizations apply for necessary dollars towards special projects, professional development activities, educational trips, etc.

Here are a few of the 2018 WALSAA Impact Grant recipients and what the funding was put towards:

- Beta Beta Beta Biological Honors Society Supported travel to the Milwaukee County Zoo to perform a comparative analysis of animal behavior between the zoo and the Henry Vilas Zoo in Madison, Wisconsin to help students articulate observations, ask meaningful questions, form hypotheses, and draw logical conclusions.
- CALS Health and Research Society Supported the CALS Undergraduate Research Symposium to help students within their area present their research at a public forum.
- Food Science Club Supported three product teams to travel to Chicago for the American Society of Baking Conference to compete with their new product ideas.
- Minorities in Agriculture Natural Resources and Related Sciences Club

  Created an Immersion Day for students of Vincent High School, in Milwaukee,

  Wisconsin, to travel to campus to learn about the opportunities within CALS.
- Plant Science Graduate Student Council Expanded the reach of their annual Plant Sciences Symposium through a webinar format to share current research and theories in plant sciences, which encouraged networking connections between fellow students, faculty, and industry representatives.
- Quarter-Scale Tractor Team Designed, built, and tested a quarter-scale pulling tractor for the International Quarter-Scale Competition held by the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers each spring.
- Saddle and Sirloin Club Sponsored world-renowned animal behavior scientist, Dr. Temple Grandin, for a community-wide talk at the UW Stock Pavilion.
- **UW-Madison National Agri-Marketing Association** Supported the travel of 21 students to attend the National Agri-Marketing Association conference in Kansas City, Missouri and compete in the student marketing competition.
