Your WALSAA marketing committee has been working on a number of items in our mission to be your CALS Connection for Life. One item is understanding the demographics of our members. Recently, we completed a membership analysis and I want to share some of what we've learned with all of you.

Here are a few things to keep in mind:

- This data is based on our January 2018 WALSAA membership list and was supported with UW Foundation demographic data.
- WALSAA has been around for more than 45 years. In that time, a number of major names and programs have changed. For this analysis, we did our best to group like majors into similar categories. One example would be agricultural journalism is now called life sciences communication.
- A variety of majors, specializations and certificates have been available under various programs through the years. Although different, these are also grouped for this analysis.
- Farm and Industry Short Course alumni members are included along with B.S. degrees for this analysis.



Rich and Fulfilling Academic Experiences for All of Our Students

On June 1, after nearly 17 years as a faculty member in the University of Wisconsin-Madison Department of Bacteriology, I have stepped into a new role as associate dean for academic affairs.

As a faculty member, my primary responsibilities were teaching and research. Throughout my tenure, I taught required courses in the undergraduate microbiology major. My research laboratory studied how bacterial cells survive in stressful environments, which is expected to help us understand how to manipulate the survival of beneficial bacteria and death of disease-causing bacteria, as necessary, to promote healthy humans, plants, and animals.

By engaging with students in my classes and my lab, I've gained a good deal of insight into the undergraduate experience. Additionally, my prior roles as co-chair of the UW–Madison biology major, director of the Master of Science Degree Program in Bacteriology, and member of the CALS Academic Planning Council have immersed me in curriculum planning and academic administration.

Through these experiences, I discovered a passion centered on the academic mission of our institution, and I'm excited to be more involved in the overall student experience in our college. My goal is to engage faculty, staff, administrators, alumni, and, of course, students as we find ways to provide rich and fulfilling academic experiences for all of our students. Support and preparation for our students as they launch or continue their careers will continue to be priorities as well. Here are some of the specific initiatives I plan to pursue:

- I believe we can do a better job reaching first-year and transfer students with all the exciting opportunities CALS has to offer academically and beyond. The success of the newly launched QuickStart Program exemplifies the need for and excitement about enhancing the overall incoming student experience, which is likely to result in increased positive undergraduate outcomes, including more deliberate planning of pathways to success.
- The senior capstone experience is another area where I see opportunities for improvement by providing more

- uniform access to rich, interdisciplinary courses to all CALS students. We are the only UW–Madison college to require such integrative coursework, and I believe it is a strong selling point for all CALS majors
- Another area I look forward to exploring is student advising. The goal is to create a strong central advising model that provides consistent and positive experiences around academic advising in addition to an increased emphasis on robust career services and advising for all CALS students.
- I will join CALS leaders and the campus as a whole to work with our community to promote an atmosphere of acceptance and inclusiveness that provides a safe, nurturing, and equitable environment for all of our students, staff, and faculty. In our academic programs, the next steps will include educating instructors about implicit bias while providing them with strategies to facilitate inclusive teaching as well as offering students more support and a greater sense of community.
- It's no secret that CALS, like the rest of the public higher education sector, faces financial challenges. We need to find new ways to generate revenue to maintain our excellence in instruction, research, outreach and extension. One focus has been to increase summer course offerings for our students that provide increased flexibility and, potentially, decrease time to graduate.
- Other areas for future attention will be to engage students beyond the UW-Madison community. Ideas to consider include providing experiences for students lacking Advanced Placement opportunities in their local high schools, creating more distant learning opportunities, and offering additional non-degree and professional training opportunities for the Wisconsin community.

I hope this outline gives you a sense of what I aim to accomplish for our CALS students. To ensure we find the best ways to achieve these goals, I am ready to listen, learn, and engage with the CALS community, including alumni, such as yourselves. I look forward to hearing from you.

The WALSAA member cost for a combined package ticket to both the Fire-Up luncheon and game is free for kids under 2 (if sitting on a lap at the game); \$65 for children 3 to 5; \$75 for children 6 to 18; and \$95 for adults (while tickets last).

Tickets can be ordered at www.WALSAA.org and must be ordered by August 25 to receive the advanced pricing. After that date, Fire-Up tickets will be sold at the gate for an additional \$5 each. All tickets are held at the event registration desk and picked up upon arrival at the Fire-Up; they are not mailed.

Liz Henry, Dane, Wisconsin, attended UW-Madison and holds bachelor's degrees from CALS in meat and animal science and dairy science. In her final year at UW-Madison, Henry received a scholarship to do international agricultural research in West Berlin, Germany. She returned and became a FISC house fellow while she finished her degree. She was the 39th Alice in Dairyland and briefly held an appointment at the UW Foundation before she received the U.S. Holstein Association Robert Rumler MBA scholarship and returned to the UW-Madison School of Business to obtain an MBA. Henry served as associate director of the Renk Agribusiness Institute, which worked closely with UW Madison.

The Henry family has also produced J. Henry & Sons Wisconsin Straight Bourbon since 2009. Since it came to market in 2015, it has been an award-winning, nationally and internationally acclaimed bourbon. They use grains developed at UW-Madison, follow sustainable practices, and their entire family is in the business working to create a legacy of Wisconsin production and to keep it growing.
