I'd like to extend my deepest thanks to everyone who helped \$35,300 in matching funds. Our grand total was an make the inaugural Day of the Badger a huge success for CALS! impressive \$67,700.

On April 9, UW-Madison alumni were invited to give, show their pride, and stay connected to the university, and all gifts made to the CALS Fund that day supported CALS QuickStart. QuickStart is a new, incredibly valuable program designed to help incoming first-year students get a summer start on coursework, reduce their time to graduation, and join a supportive cohort of scholars.

Over the course of the day, 156 supporters from 30 different states and four countries made gifts, and many were firsttime donors. The event inspired others to give who haven't donated in the last 10 years or more. Clearly, this program - and the CALS mission - resonate with Day of the Badger participants. In the words of one donor, "The QuickStart program is a wonderful opportunity for students to start exploring early on what CALS has to offer. I like supporting this."

To incentivize individual donors, WALSAA contributed a \$2,500 matching gift, and our Board of Visitors generated

These funds help position QuickStart for a promising second year. We have 103 QuickStart students in the 2019/20 cohort who have already begun the online component of the program. Sixty-two of those students are from Wisconsin, and the rest hail from 11 other states. Forty-five QuickStart students will benefit from scholarships. This year, we were able to award more and larger need-based scholarships to make the program more accessible, especially for those with the greatest need.

One exciting change for QuickStart this summer involves the program's peer mentors. All nine of them are from last year's cohort, so this year's students will truly be learning from and with their peers — one of the program's many strengths.

Thank you again for your support of QuickStart, CALS and UW-Madison. With your help, our students can truly make the most out of their time with us.

As in years past, the 2019 Fire-Up will feature the WALSAA Silent Auction to raise money to support scholarships, awards and student activities. Last year, more than \$24,000 was raised. This year's auction will feature a variety of items, such as week-long lodgings in Hawaii and Door County, a pedal tractor, Packers tickets, UW Badger men's basketball tickets, and much more! Be sure to check out our family pricing for 2019 on page 7! Fire-Up luncheon tickets are free for those 5 years old and younger; \$10 for children 6 to 18; and \$30 for adults. \$15 of the adult ticket price is a fully tax-deductible donation to WALSAA. The member cost for a combined package ticket to both the Fire-Up luncheon and game is free for kids under 2 (if sitting on a lap at the game); \$65 for children 3 to 5; \$70 for children 6 to 18; and \$90 for adults (while tickets last).

Tickets can be ordered at www.WALSAA.org and must be ordered by August 20 to receive the advanced pricing. After that date, Fire-Up tickets will be sold at the gate for an additional \$5 each. All tickets are held at the event registration desk and picked up upon arrival at Fire-Up; they are not mailed.

Stieve was named this year's recipient because of her dedication and support of WALSAA for many years. She has served on the WALSAA Board for four three-year terms and was president of the organization last year. For more than two decades, Stieve has helped clerk the Fire-Up Silent Auction. She played a crucial role in the establishment of the WALSAA Impact Grants for CALS student organizations, the execution of the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration and can even be credited with naming the "Red Jacket" Award she will be honored with next month.
