Rachel Zwieg graduated from UW-Madison's Farm and Industry Short Course in 2008. She earned certificates in both Soil Science and Green Industry. Rachel is an owner operator at Zwieg's Maple Acres LLC, a seventh-generation robotic dairy and crop farm. Rachel and her husband Kyle have focused on sustainability efforts and the integration of technology to gain efficiency and economic advantage. Zwieg's Maple Acres has been the top producing robotic dairy in North America for multiple years. Rachel and Kyle lead the way in preserving farmland by being one of the first 15 farms to enroll in a conservation easement in 2010 through the State of Wisconsin's PACE Program (Purchase of Agricultural Conservation Easements). Rachel and Kyle were selected as National Outstanding Young Farmers in 2023. The couple have three children, Theodore, and twins Landon and Logan.

# **CALS MESSAGE**

### The Inaugural FISC AgForward Was a Success: A Recap

In the Winter 2023 issue of WALSAA Connection, I was very excited to offer a preview of FISC AgForward, a multi-day educational opportunity offered by the Farm and Industry Short Courses program at CALS. I return to you with great enthusiasm to follow up about this revamped program.

The inaugural FISC AgForward took place at UW-Madison's Center for Dairy Research (CDR) on January 16-19. The theme of the short course was "The Dairy Industry in an Everchanging Landscape," with sessions focusing on agricultural economics, dairy diet and nutrition, reproduction, genetics, and animal welfare.

As a reminder, the new short course complements the residential FISC program at UW-River Falls (UWRF), and I am pleased to report that a majority of UWRF FISC students chose to participate. The sessions offered students an opportunity to learn about the latest university research, engage in meaningful discussions, and pose questions to CALS faculty. Participants enjoyed up-close interactions with CALS faculty, and they gave the program great evaluations all around. It was incredible to see how this newly developed program came together, and the level of engagement from participants was outstanding.

I'll use the second day of the program to share examples of the course content and organization. Luiz Ferrareto, an assistant professor and extension specialist in the Department of Animal and Dairy Sciences, reviewed forage production and management and described its impact on cow digestion, behavior, and productivity. And Marta Moura Kohmann, an assistant professor and extension specialist in the Department of Plant and Agroecosystem Sciences, went over the production potential of different forage crops under

Other short court sessions were led by CALS faculty members and extension specialists Paul Fricke, Jennifer Van Os, and Kent Weigel from animal and dairy sciences and Paul Mitchell from agricultural and applied economics. They covered topics in their respective areas of expertise.

Part one will take place on the morning of July 11, proceeding the Potato Research Field Day at the Hancock Agricultural Research Station, and the second day is July 16, with a morning classroom session at Hancock and an afternoon field experience at Flyte Family Farms in Coloma, Wisconsin.

The Spanish for Dairy Series will be offered again as well. Level 1 will be offered in September, with live sessions on Wednesdays, 11 a.m. to noon. Level 2 will be offered in February 2025.

Sprecher Enhancement Awards are scholarship awards to CALS graduating seniors who has shown outstanding leadership and academic excellence and exemplifies the qualities that

the late Nancy Sprecher displayed during her career. Nancy J. Sprecher grew up in Wisconsin. She graduated from the UW-Madison in 1978 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Agricultural Journalism. She began her career as a market analyst at DeKalb AgResearch and Gene Kroupa Associates, and then joined the Wisconsin Milk Marketing Board, first as Executive Vice-President and rising to Chief Operating Officer. Toward the end of her long career, she moved to Minneapolis, MN, and became a director of Women's Food Service Forum, an organization that promotes women in leadership positions in agriculture and food related industries. Sprecher was successful in a male-dominated field and paved the way for other women to move ahead in those industries. When she died in 2021 at just 64 years of age, her wish was to have a scholarship fund established at CALS that would support the careers of students' postgraduation. This award began in 2023 and was made possible by Lon and Sue Sprecher and Steve Yaun.



Rick & Peggy Daluge

Rick & Peggy Daluge Recognition Award begins in 2024 for sophomore students who demonstrate excellence in academics, leadership and service to the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences community. Rick and Peggy Daluge both graduated from CALS at UW-Madison. Rick with BS 71, MS 75, PhD 82 and Peggy with a BS in 1970. Rick joined the CALS administration as director of Career Services, Student Recruitment, and WALSAA Sec-Treasurer. Both Peggy and Rick were charter members of WALSAA. Rick retired in 2008 after 36 years with the UW and 25 years as Director of the Farm and Industry Short Course. He worked with WALSAA during this entire time and helped grow the group from 300 members to over 2,000. Peggy held numerous positions in addition to raising two children, Tracy and Mark, both CALS graduates. Peggy worked with the Brown Swiss Association, Farm Credit of Madison, two stints as 4-H agent in Dane County, and 15 years as the Director of Business World, a program for high school students.

They enjoy giving back to students through scholarships. With the transfer of the FISC program, they are pleased to support WALSAA in their efforts to recognize outstanding students. This award is made possible by Rick and Peggy Daluge.
